

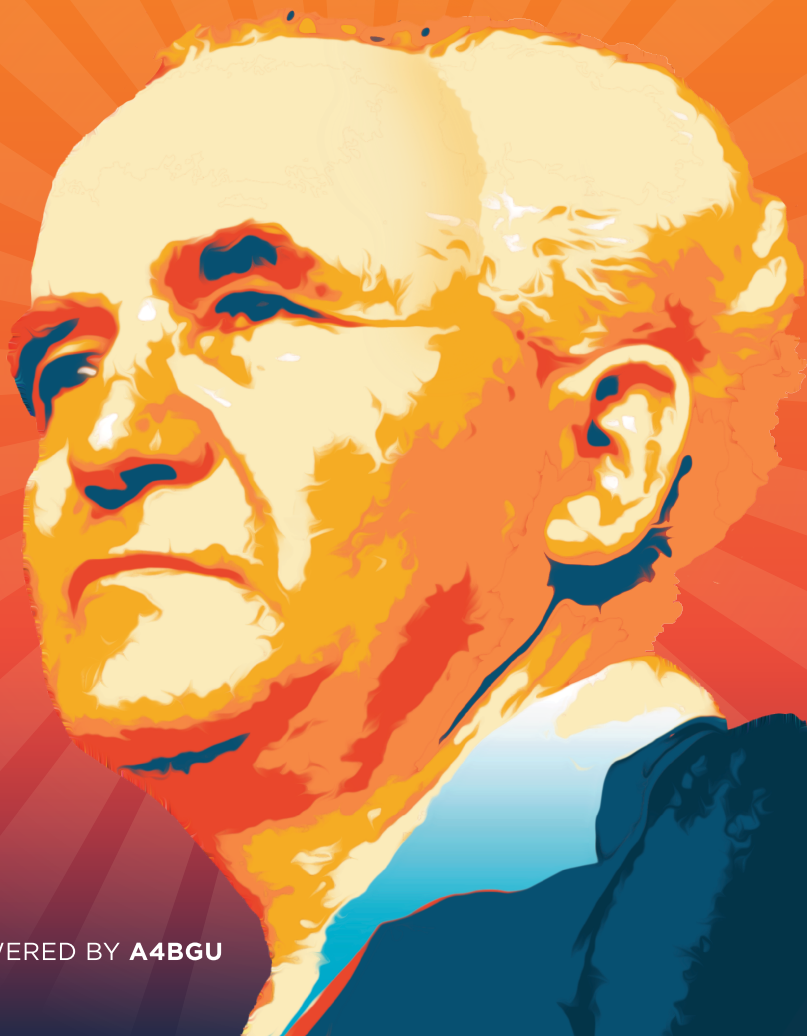

On October 16th, 1886,
David Grouen (later known
as David Ben-Gurion) was
born in Plonsk, Poland.

Ben-Gurion co-founded a
Zionist youth group called
“Ezra” to teach Jewish
children Hebrew and
encourage emigration
to the Holy Land.

In 1906, at the age of 20, David Grouen made Aliyah (moving to the land of Israel),– taking the first step toward his dream of becoming a pioneer and farmer.

David Grouen moved to Jerusalem and became the editor of a newspaper called "Achdut" ("unity"). While in Jerusalem, he changed his last name to Ben-Gurion.

Ben-Gurion and his friend Yitzhak Ben-Zvi traveled to Turkey to study law. With the outbreak of World War I, he did not complete his studies and returned to the Holy Land.

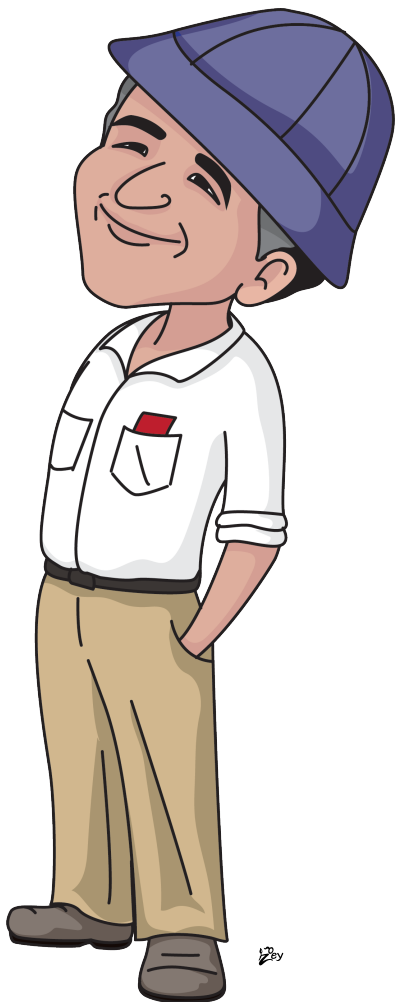
While on a visit to America, Ben-Gurion met Paula Munweis in New York and they married at City Hall. Soon after, he left to join the British Army. Geula, their first child, was born on September 11th, 1919. His two other children, Amos and Renana, were born a few years later.

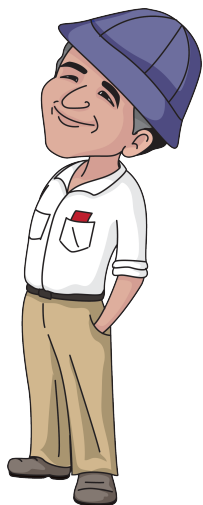
HISTADRUT SECRETARY

Ben-Gurion became the head of the Histadrut, the General Organization of Workers in Israel. In this role, he was responsible for addressing the needs of Jewish workers in the region.

Before the Jewish state was officially established, Ben-Gurion headed the Jewish Agency, which managed the country's affairs and represented its interests to the international community.



1948

FIRST PRIME MINISTER OF ISRAEL

Ben-Gurion helped write the Declaration of Independence, and officially declared Israel's independence on Friday, May 14th – just a day before the end of the British Mandate in Israel. He was elected first Prime Minister of Israel the following year.

While serving as Minister of Defense, Ben-Gurion created the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) as a "people's army" and served as their first Security Minister.

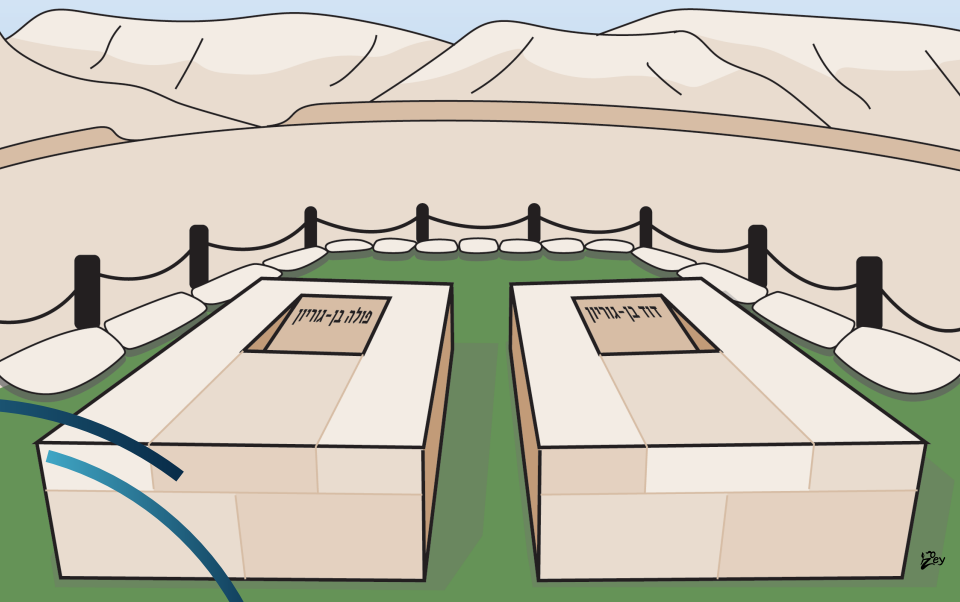
Ben-Gurion retired from government and moved to Kibbutz Sde Boker with his wife Paula – finally fulfilling his pioneer dream of settling in the Negev. He is quoted as saying, "It is in the Negev that the people of Israel will be tested."

David Ben-Gurion passed away on December 1st, 1973, and was buried in Midreshet Ben-Gurion in the Negev beside his wife, Paula.
